

OSIRIS Online Application



Application procedure

- 1. Check the website for entry requirements, deadlines, & documents.
- 2. Apply via Studielink
- 3. Upload required documents in Osiris Online Application (*)
- 4. Pay the application fee and submit your application
- 5. Admissions Office checks your previous education
- 6. Application goes to the Admissions Committee of the Graduate School
- 7. Conditional acceptance
- 8. Send hard copy documents to the Admissions Office
- 9. Unconditional acceptance
- You can apply before having finished secondary school/Bachelor Degree
- You can apply before having taken the English Language Test
- You can apply for more than 1 programme at the same time

It is difficult to estimate how long does the process takes. But the earlier you apply, the easiest it becomes to complete the conditions and visa procedure! (The most difficult step is waiting for an answer!)

Housing

- Unlike other countries, in the Netherlands, it is uncommon for universities to provide accommodation for students.
- However, we try our best to provide the best information and help during the 'house hunting' period.

Tips

Several ways of finding accommodation:

- 'private rental' though agencies, websites
- SSH reserved (especially for international students/staff)
- SSH regular
- Beware of fake announcements: Check the recommendations in universities's website!

Good to know

Hospiteren: Current students will pick their new housemate
So it helps to actually be in NL.

Rent is roughly €350 - €900 per month (in Utrecht).



Also look for:

- Temporary accommodation (e.g. through HousingAnywhere)
- A bit further from main cities like Utrecht (e.g. Zeist, Nieuwegein)
