Climate in Sweden

- Autumn (Sept–Nov): colorful but rather windy and rainy, 10–15°C
- Winter (Dec–March): temperatures down to -15°C but most often just below 0°C
- Spring (March–May): usually sunny and windy with temperatures around 10–15°C
- Summer (June–Aug): most of the time warm and sunny with temperatures above 20°C

- Established in 2010 as a merger between Växjö University (1967) and University of Kalmar (1977)

- Sweden's sixth largest university in terms of number of students

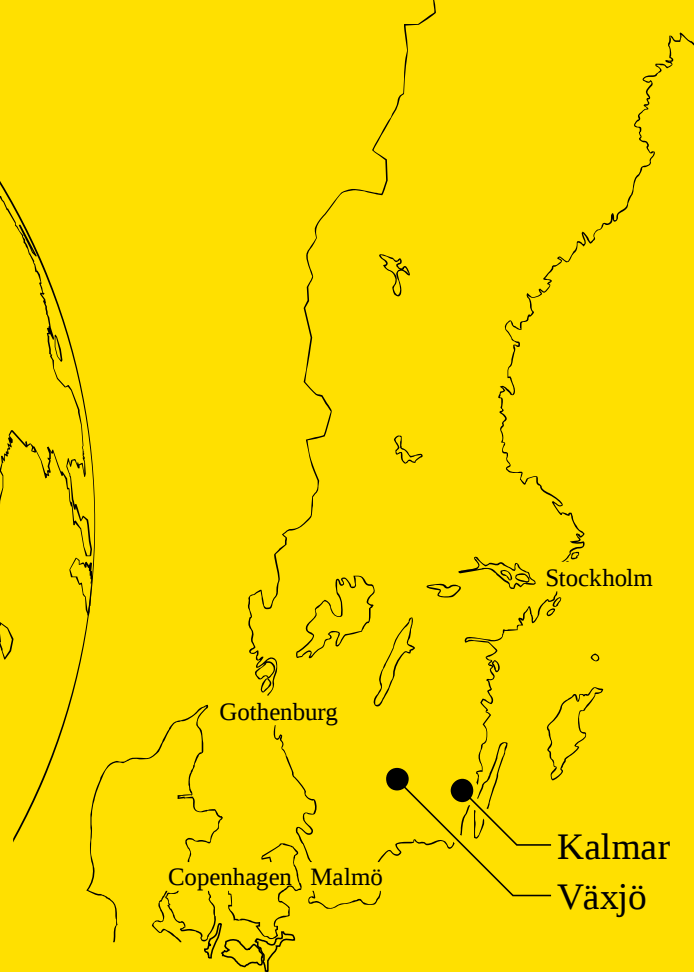
- Linnaeus University offer subjects within arts and humanities, health and life sciences, the social sciences, the natural sciences, technology, and business and economics

Where is Linnaeus University situated?

- Southern Sweden, Scandinavia
- Two-campus university, Växjö and Kalmar (1 hour by train between the two)
- 2.5 hrs/3.5 hrs by train from Copenhagen airport
- 3-4 hrs by train to Stockholm




Växjö – a living campus

Kalmar – a student city by the sea

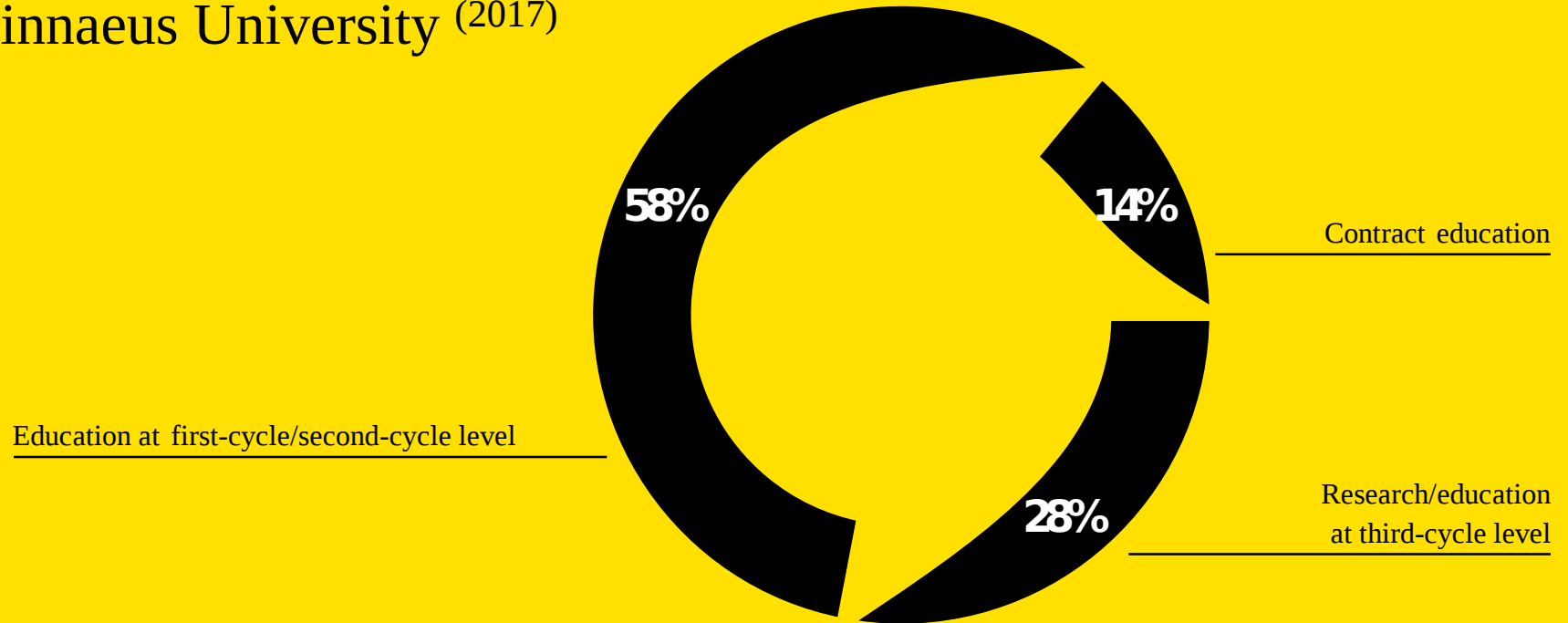
- Capital of the County of Kalmar with 70,000 inhabitants
- Internationally prominent research is carried out in the natural sciences, linked to the nearby Baltic Sea
- Internationally renowned maritime academy
- A city integrated university location. New facilities from 2019.



Linnaeus University in the world

- Roughly 730 incoming international students each year
- 2,000 active international students (2019)
- About 290 outgoing exchange students each year

Why a top-up year?

For students who do not meet the requirements for a Master programme; studies equivalent to a Bachelor degree. For students who have unfinished studies.

Top-up years can be offered within:

- Business Administration
- Mathematics
- Electrical Engineering
- Computer Science
- Peace and Development Studies, 1,5 years
- Biology
- Mechanical Engineering

Linnaeus University Summer Academy

- International, intercultural and interdisciplinary study environment – unique of its kind in Sweden
- Runs between mid July – mid August
- All courses originate in Swedish culture and an innovative mindset. Strong student focus and workshop-oriented.
- Range from language, human rights and entrepreneurship to sports and sustainability.
- 232 students from 35 countries (2017).





Why Linnaeus University?

- *High quality of life.* Växjö declared "The greenest city in Europe" and Kalmar, a charming medieval tourist city, located by the Baltic Sea.

Scholarship programmes

- *Linnaeus University Scholarship Programme*. Up to 100 % coverage of tuition fee.
- *Swedish Institute Scholarship Programme*. Full coverage of tuition fee and living costs.
- *Linnaeus Academy of Science and Business*. Up to 100 % coverage of tuition fee for master programmes and full coverage of tuition fees and living costs for Summer Academy.

Approximately 100 scholarship holders Summer and Autumn semester 2018.



India – Entry requirements

For entry to a Master's study programme, the minimum requirement is a 4-year Bachelor's degree, or a Bachelor's degree followed by a Master's degree. Some, but not all, study programmes require for that first degree to be in a related field.

Consideration will also be given to applicants who have attained a 3-year Bachelor's degree with honours in certain social science or humanities majors.

Students holding only a 3-year Bachelor's degree without honours will not satisfy the entry requirements for a Master's programme.
