




The Italian academic system

How do you apply...

...TO A DEGREE PROGRAM (UNDERGRADUATE AND POSTGRADUATE DEGREE)

4 STEPS TO ENROL

- 1 Fill out the online application on apply.unito.it (Apply@UniTo), within the yearly deadlines

- 2 Once obtained the acceptance letter from UniTo, submit the enrolment application via [Universitaly portal](#) to the Italian embassy or consulate in your country within the [deadline](#) established every year by the Italian Ministry of University and Research [For non-EU applicants residing abroad only]

- 3 To confirm your enrolment, make sure to provide the **International Students Desk** with all required documents listed in the acceptance letter

- 4 Ask for an Italian residence permit for studying purpose (Permesso di soggiorno per motivi di studio) at the University **Residence Permit Office**

Frequently asked questions (FAQ)

Requirements to study in Italy?

• Undergraduate degree and 5-year or 6-year postgraduate degree

You must have completed upper secondary education (at least 12 years of schooling) as well as holding a valid school certificate qualifying for HE studies in your home country.

A qualification obtained after 11 or 10 years of schooling does not allow access to Italian universities unless you satisfy one of the following conditions:

- attendance of one or two additional years of university studies depending on the Educational system (if made by 11 or 10 years);
- have obtained a post-secondary qualification in a subject related to the degree program you wish to enrol in
- have attended a preparatory program (*Foundation program*), to compensate the missing year of schooling (in case of 11 years). Find more about the [Foundation program](#) of the University of Torino.

• Postgraduate degree program

You need to hold a relevant undergraduate degree (at least 3 years of university education) or equivalent degree diploma, granting access to the upper level of university education.

Do I have to pass an Italian language test?

If you are a non-EU student residing abroad and you wish to enrol in an undergraduate or 5-year postgraduate degree program not requiring an admission exam you must take an Italian language test. If you wish to enrol in a postgraduate degree program, your knowledge of Italian language will be verified during the admission interview.
